Who is required to have Medical Certification?



All Commercial Fishing crew must have Medical Certification from 30 November 2023

MSN 1883 (Amend1) states: All Commercial Fishing crew must have Medical Certification - from 30 November 2023

Fishermen who apply for their medical cert before 30 November have Grandfather Rights.

Who needs an ENG1 Cert?

- Over 24 m
- Subject to inspection at foreign port
- At sea more than 72 hours
- Operating beyond 200 nm or Continental Shelf

And Skippers/Officers holding a Certificate of Competence over 16.5 m

Who needs an ML5 Cert?

- Less than 24 m
- Not Subject to inspection at foreign port
- Not At sea more than 72 hours
- Not Operating beyond 200 nm or Continental Shelf

Or you are NOT a skipper with Certificate of Competence over 16.5 m

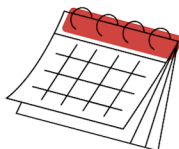
